Port Browning Rendezvous May 15-17, 2015

We will be gathering at Pt Browning Marina for the May Long Weekend May15-17 this year. The Marina has been significantly upgraded since the last rendezvous many years ago. There is a large new shower/ restroom area with showers for 1 looney for 4 mins. There are laundry facilities and wifi is free. The pub food is great and the views unmatched from the deck. Check out the link to the Pt Browning website on our website for detailed menus.

There is improved power delivery to the slips with both 30amp and 15amp available, however there may not be power for every boat as it is a busy weekend. I would recommend arriving as early as possible to secure power if you need it.

Moorage will be \$1.25 per foot, 30amp power - \$8, 15 amp power - \$7. Do not call the marina for space, you must register with me as I will be providing a master list to the dock master one week before our rendezvous.

We will be dining on Baby Back Ribs and salads from the Pub on Sat. night. We have rented the party tent (no rain!!) and the Pub will supply dinner, plates and cutlery for \$25.00 per couple plus tax & gratuity. I had these ribs last summer and they are amazing so plan on being hungry, we eat at 5:30

CS West San Juan Islands Cruise June 21-30, 2015

This year we are going to try something new, a cruise through the San Juans as a group. The tentative schedule follows. I was trying to arrange a mid-week special bus ride around Orcas but the cost would have been prohibitive so we need to be at Deer Hbr. for their normal scheduled week end runs. The cost will be \$10US per person for a round trip and you will be able to get off in East Sound for shopping and pick it up again to get back to Deer Hbr. They also require exact change.

<u>Everyone needs to make their own reservations if you plan to use the marinas at some of our stops (the contact information is on the following schedule). We start our cruise at Roche Hbr. so it gives an extra day to arrive, clear customs and pickup supplies. Roche recommended you make reservations ASAP since they are filling up fast!</u>

If we're lucky, we might be able to use the party dock and the Bar-B-Que at Roche if it isn't already reserved. The cruise starts in Roche but you can catch up with us anywhere along the way. One reason we go to Reid Hbr. right after Roche is not only is it a great place to visit but it gives some of us a breather and also gives others a couple of extra days to catch up.

Finally, when going back to Canada via Spieden Channel, time it for favorable currents since it has some of the strongest currents in the area.

Some Customs Info:

Following are also some guidelines on what you can bring into the US:

- Condiments such as oil, vinegar, mustard, catsup, pickles, syrup, honey without honey combs, jelly, and jam.
- Foodstuffs such as bakery items, candy, and chocolate.
- Hard cured cheeses without meat, such as parmesan or cheddar.
- Canned goods and goods in vacuum-packed jars (except those containing meat or poultry products) for personal use.
- Fish or fish products for personal use.
- Powdered drinks sealed in original containers with ingredients listed in English.
- One liter of alcohol per person

Dry mixes containing dairy and egg ingredients (such as baking mixes, cocoa mixes, drink mixes, instant cake mixes, instant pudding mixes, liquid drink mixes containing reconstituted dry milk or dry milk products, potato flakes, and infant formula) that are commercially labeled, presented in final finished packaging, and require no further manipulation of the product are generally allowed.

CS West San Juan Islands Cruise June 21-30, 2015

All agriculture items must be declared and are subject to inspection by a CBP Agriculture Specialist at ports of entry to ensure they are free of plant pests and foreign animal diseases.

Fruits and vegetables grown in Canada are generally admissible, if they have labels identifying them as products of Canada. Fruits and vegetables merely purchased in Canada are not necessarily admissible, i.e. citrus or tropical fruits such as mangos, which clearly were not grown in Canada because it does not have a climate that supports those crops.

Potatoes from western regions of Canada are currently restricted because of a disease outbreak. While commercial imports are permitted under stringent guidelines, travelers from Canada should avoid bringing raw potatoes with them into the U.S.

Food products from Canada, including pet food and fresh (frozen or chilled), cooked, canned or otherwise processed products containing beef, veal, bison, and cervid (e.g. deer, elk, moose, caribou etc.) are now permitted from Canada but you must provide proof of the origin of beef, pork, poultry, cervid meat, and pet food in order to bring them into the United States. Examples of proof of origin include the grocery store receipt where the product was purchased or the label on the product indicating the province in which it was packaged. Products containing sheep, lamb, or goat will not be allowed entry. Food products should be commercially packaged and sealed with ingredients listed in English.

Raw poultry & eggs, goat and lamb not allowed but you can bring if cooked (i.e cooked chicken and hardboiled eggs). No citrus fruit, tomatoes, peppers and 'above ground' onions (e.g. green onion, leaks, etc.).

Easy day trip since Reid is right across from Roche Buy freshly made donuts before you leave for Reid Leave Roche about 10:00 to catch buoys in Reid Reid has 20 buoys and plenty of anchorage (all State Marine Parks buoys are \$12US) Reid also has a linear moorage system that will hold several boats Activities include walking on the island's trails especially to the old school house Reid has a dock for dinghies and pump out station.

Wed. 6/24 - Thurs. 6/25: Sucia Is. (Echo Bay) Apprx. 15 mi.

Leave Reid between 8:00 - 9:00 to catch the current down Spieden Echo Bay also has 2 linear moorage systems and 14 buoys plus anchorage space Activities include walking on the island's trails and 'scoping out' the anchorage at Fossil Bay Sucia can be a point of departure to head back to Pt. Roberts or Vancouver

Fri. 6/26 - Sat 6/27: Orcas Is. (Deer Hbr. 360-376-3037) Apprx. 12 mi.

Make reservations beforehand or there is limited anchorage in the bay <u>At noon</u> we'll have a bus ride around Orcas. It is a hop-on / hop-off bus ride with shopping in East Sound

There is a nice restaurant up the road from the marina if you don't want to eat on the boat This can be a departure point to Bedwell or Sidney for those going back to Canada

Sun. 6/28: Friday Hbr. 360-378-2688 Apprx. 6 mi.

Make reservations beforehand because there isn't any anchorage Shopping in town This can also be a departure point if going back to Canada

Mon. 6/29: Spencer Spit (Lopez Is.) Apprx. 8 mi.

11 buoys at spit (8 north, 3 south) Plenty of anchorage on south side Activity is go to shore and walk around

Tues. 6/30: West Sound Orcas Is. Apprx. 8 mi.

Try to get a reciprocal at the Orcas Is. YC dock (nice pub across the road) If no reciprocal, make reservations at West Sound Marina (360-376-2314) If all else fails, go to Deer Hbr.

BC Maritime Museum

Re: MMBC is critical to Victoria and it needs to be on the Inner Harbour

Victoria has a long and romantic history of being a steamship port, and a fulcrum of visitors passing on journeys between the West and the Orient.

Why does Victoria's history matter? Because people want to visit and live in interesting places. This keeps the economy healthy and it keeps people caring about their own city.

We need to tell our own story about why we are interesting. This will bring tourists who want to stay in Victoria for a few days. Right now, I think they take a quick look at the dwindling retail on Government Street and are ready to leave.

The BC Maritime Museum is central to our story. It should be right on the Inner Harbour where the steamships used to come. There should be a "Passport" that takes visitors on their own small journey, emulating the steamship experience. They could pass through the Maritime Museum, then across to the Provincial Museum and legislature to learn more about the province. Like the Titanic exhibit, museum visitors could get names and identities at an "Arrivals" desk that might take them to Chinatown, a boarding house in James Bay, or the Empress.

If visitors and residents are given a bit of help to appreciate the romance of Victoria, they also are better able to appreciate the beauty of the old buildings downtown. A great deal of capital is expended on making Victoria visually appealing, but it becomes hollow when the story we tell about our city is just T-shirts and soap.

Arguably, the Maritime Museum and the Provincial Museum are of benefit to everyone who lives in Victoria; they keep our fascinating history alive, they give a rich and varied tourist experience, and they make residents feel lucky to live here.

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Spring is around the corner and I suspect most of you are starting to check things out on your boat. If you live in the lower VCR island area, the BC Maritime Museum's annual "**Massive Marine Garage Sale**" is a must to visit, both to sell items that you have kicking around the basement or to look for things that 'might come in handy'.

Takes place at Ogden Pt, by the harbour breakwater. Worth checking out. I have seen a CS table several times! --- Barry Rolston
